Sixth Form Scholarships

Peponi School prides itself on the success of our pupils at gaining entry to many of the world's leading universities. In the past five years Peponians have secured places at University College London, Yale University, London School of Economics, McGill University, University of Cambridge, Imperial College London, University of Chicago, Williams College, University of Toronto, Strathmore University, University of Nairobi amongst many others. Pupils have secured places to read for many competitive courses such as Law, Medicine and Engineering. Our Sixth Form programme not only encourages applications to such universities and courses but also prepares pupils to be successful when they are studying for their degrees - many of them gaining very high G.P.A.s and First Class awards.

The Sixth Form Scholarship programme allows pupils from all schools to compete for an award at either Scholarship or at Exhibition level. All Sixth Form Scholarship candidates will write a series of academic papers but should also have references from a teacher of at least one of their chosen areas of extra-curricular involvement. These reflect the School's commitment to a broader contribution to life beyond the classroom.

Applicants must submit copies of their most recent academic reports, demonstrating a minimum achievement of **A* to B grades** in all subjects.



Academic Papers

There are three parts to the academic assessments:

Part I – these are the compulsory papers and candidates are expected to demonstrate excellence in all areas:

- · Mathematics (General Arithmetic and basic Algebra skills)
- English (Comprehension)
- · General Paper

Part II – candidates are expected to choose two papers from the list below. These may, but not necessarily, reflect the areas of interest in their A Level options:


- · Mathematics II
- English Literature
- Modern Foreign Language (one from French or Spanish)
- Physics
- · Chemistry
- Biology
- Geography
- History
- Economics and Business Studies
- · Ethics and Philosophy
- Social Science

Part III - All candidates will be expected to present a piece of extended writing when they arrive for assessment. This can be on any topic of interest to the candidate. The word count is less important than the content but for guidance we recommend something in the order of 800-1000 words.

All candidates will have two interviews:

Election Committee. This is a panel of three members of the School's Common Room, one of whom will be a member of the Senior Leadership Team. The committee will focus on academic interests of the candidate and base some of their questions on the response given in the General Paper. A fairly good knowledge of current national and international affairs will be expected.


VI Form Election Committee. This is a panel of two members of the school's Senior Council (Upper VI Form pupils) and the Head of VI Form. This committee will focus on the candidate's wider interests and will examine the broader contributions of the pupil to the school. All VI Form Scholars will be expected to contribute to the leadership, extra-curricular and academic success of Peponi School.

Candidates will be expected to present exceptional papers in Part I of the Scholarship examination. They should then choose two from the following Part II papers:

Candidates will be expected to present exceptional papers in English and the General Paper. They will also be expected to do well in two of the following papers:


